2016 Spring Show and Plant Sale

This year will be our **20th** annual Spring Show. It will be held on the weekend after Easter on Saturday **2nd April,** in the Aston Clinton School Hall. The show opens to the public at 2.00pm. Entry is £1, children free. Exhibitors must have their entries on the show benches by 10.30. Entry night is the previous Wednesday **30th March, 6.00 – 7.45pm at the Anthony Hall.**

Those of you who have trophies, please return them to Ken Halls by entry night at the latest. Full details of all the classes are in the schedule which comes with this newsletter. The show includes all the regular features and classes. There are plenty of challenges for everyone to have a go and enter something. As it is our 20th Show some of the classes will reflect this milestone.

The Spring Show naturally concentrates on the huge variety of daffodils that have been bred over the years and reflect the 11 divisions plus miniatures that can be grown. They are not just the standard yellow, but include mixtures of yellow – white, all white and some with, red, orange and pink (hence the village pink class). Come and see, and bring your friends and family. Discover what local amateurs can grow.

Look through the schedule; there are plenty of classes for novices who perhaps only have the daffodils they can find in the garden, and encourage your children or grandchildren to enter. Even if you have not got any daffodils to show the other half of the schedule covers a whole range of competitive classes from Floral Art through Spring flowers, tulips, a domestic section for the cooks amongst us, handicrafts, and the children's sections for different age groups. Please note there is a new class 51A for floating heads of Hellebore flowers in a bowl no larger than 10ins in diameter.

Remember there will also be the Society's plant sale. We will be selling trailing geraniums, fuchsias, sweet peas, a range of perennials, primulas and other early pot and bedding plants.
