Enorma,
Desiree (string-less)
White Apollo (white flowered)

Beetroot

Boltardy – can be sown earlier than most Pablo (F1) Solo (F1 monogerm)

Broccoli

Bordeaux (F1) – dwarf and early

Claret – (F1) tall and prolific

Purple – mixed with several different strains, very hardy

Brussels Sprouts

Franklin – early F1, similar to Peer Gynt
Maximus – early F1, later sowings harvest mid-season
Silverline - mid season F1
Braveheart – late F1, good flavour

Cabbage

<u>Spring</u> – *Pixie* (hearted), *Mastergreen* (greens), *Duncan* (F1 dual-purpose)

<u>Summer</u> – *Hispi* (F1 pointed), *Minicole* (F1 round), *Puma* (F1 round)

<u>Autumn</u> – few specific autumn types now, most summer types will crop until early winter

<u>Winter</u> – *Celtic* (hardy and large), *Tundra* (hardy dark and sweet), *Winchester* (small and hardy)

<u>Savoy</u> – a lot of new and very good F1 varieties: - *Mila*, small and very early; *Clarissa*, early;

<u>Tarvoy</u>, mid season, small; *Wivoy*, late

Kabuki (early F1), Trixie (mid F1), Hydra (late F1)

Carrot

Early – Adelaide (F1), Primo (F1) Maincrop – Maestro (F1 Berlicum type), Autumn King

Cauliflower

<u>Summer</u> – *Mayflower* (F1 earliest), *Fremont*, syn. *Freedom* (F1 small), *Gypsy* (F1 large) <u>Autumn</u> – *Lindon* (F1), *Regata* (F1 holds well) <u>Winter</u> – *Evita*, *Jerome* (F1)

Celery and Celeriac

<u>Celery –</u> Celebrity, Granada (F1 strong flavour) <u>Celeriac - Monarch</u>

Glasshouse Crops

<u>Cucumber - Femdan - F1 long; Petita, Socrates - F1 short.</u>

Cucumber Rootstock - Triumph (F1) - from Moles Seeds

<u>Pepper - Bellboy</u> (F1 box-type thick walled), *Corno di torro*, *Corno di rossi*, etc. (thin-walled long pointed and sweet), *Jalapeno* (very small, hot and prolific)

<u>Tomato</u> - Herald (standard, excellent flavour), Big Boy (beefsteak), Gardener's Delight (cherry), Red Alert (cherry), Sungold (orange cherry) Tropical Ruby (baby plum)

Tomato Rootstock - Aegis (F1), Arnold (F1) - from Moles Seeds

Leeks

Early - King Richard (very long shank), Kingston (F1, very early)

Maincrop - Jolant (reasonable rust resistance), Oarsman (F1, mid-season but holds well, good rust resistance), Toledo (late)

Onions (bulb)

Sets - Hytech (Yellow, F1), Red Baron (longest storing red)

Seed – Marco (Yellow, F1, very long storing), Red Baron (longest storing red)

Parsnips

Long rooted - Cobham Improved Marrow, Javelin (F1), Gladiator (F1)

Short rooted – Avonresister, best for shallow soils (not available for 2013)

Peas

Early - Kelvedon Wonder

Maincrop – Hurst Greenshaft

Mangetout - Oregon Sugar Pod

Sugarsnap - Sugar Ann

Potatoes

First early – Accent (carries on bulking-up)

Second early - Charlotte (salad type)

Maincrop – King Edward (the best, but difficult to grow)

Root Brassicas

Swede - Marion

Turnip - Tokyo Cross (F1)
